Dave M. The department has been scrambling to keep up with grass cutting. Its' been a rough deal this spring with all the rain. With the 3 returning summer help employees and the additional two this year will be a tremendous help. Also, the department is trying to catch up with the number of holes that developed over the winter. We have had the street sweeper out for the last couple of weeks. Limb and branch pickup is completed as of yesterday.

Kim M. Today Darlene and I went to an East gate Council of Governments, which is updating their safety planning initiative. They are early in the process of inventorying and making sure they set some priorities to reduce traffic injuries and improve our roadways. We want to make sure Howland is represented in this regional effort.
