The five part time summer helpers finished up this week. All five of them were excellent workers and we are looking forward to seeing them work again next year. We are starting to do some prep work prior to the paving program.

Kim-Planning Director

We have one more food truck night on September 6 at the gazebo. Farmers Market is still going strong. Alli is really doing a nice job making sure there is local produce there. Over the past month I have been working with Dan Morgan, the new Zoning Administrator. We have over 200 complaints in our system and he has it whittled down to about 85. He is inspecting, writing letters and following up on all complaints.

Janice Clark – 8464 Old Orchard Rd

I have talked to Peter Ross numerous times. The property next to the dance studio, where the old house sat, that the fire department burned down needs the grass cut. I know they only cut it twice a year, but I don't feel that we should have to look at the high grass. It is atrocious. It is an undeveloped lot and is not being cut.

Generally we try and talk to the property owner to see if they will voluntarily cut it. We will try and reach out to the property owner.

Janice

My second problem is when we bought the house in 2012, that's when Capes owned the dance studio. They had the fence with the barbed wire. We were told that they had to take that down and build a retaining wall. Capes moved and then Johnny K's went in it. The fence was still there. The dance studio moved in and took the fence down, put up a wooden fence up, but did not install a retaining wall. We are losing our backyard under the fence.
